The Bishop's Page

I love this verse from Psalm 63: “My soul clings to you, your right hand holds me fast.” Luther will use the verb, to cling, more than 550 times in his works and most of those occurrences are in his commentaries on the scriptures. The German verb used often is ‘hangen’ to hang onto, to cleave to, as if my whole live depends upon it. Luther uses justification in his theological treatises, but he uses, to cling, in his preaching and teaching when he is describing faith relationally.

Preaching on John 3:16, Luther confessed, “Christ wants to prevent us from thinking of Him as separate from the Father....He wants to say, ‘Whoever beholds the Father’s love also beholds Mine; for Our love is identical. I love you with a love that redeems you from sin and death. And the Father’s love, which gave you His only Son, is just as miraculous.’” [Sermons on the Gospel of John Chapters 1-4. LW 22:355]

Then he writes on that same verse, “Whoever believes in the Son will have eternal life. Cling to His neck or to His garment...cling to death’s Destroyer....If I cling to Christ in true faith and remain in Him, it is impossible for sin and death to accuse and condemn me.” [Sermons on the Gospel of John Chapters 1-4. LW 22:35]

And I cling to God, BECAUSE, “your right hand holds me fast.” So read also, Ps 139:7-10, Ps 118:15-16, and Luther’s Works, Vol 37, the Treatise on “This is my body” where Luther says that Jesus doesn’t sit on the right hand of God, Jesus IS the wielding power of God that can be everywhere, even in millions of chalices around the world on a Sunday morning.

A 6th anniversary of 9/11, an ongoing war in Iraq, even one in six Americans receiving aid for their daily bread, a sagging economy, sexuality discussions, my child’s well-being, my health, vocation, and personal concerns, my bondage to sin, my birth, my death, and forever still, my baptism, my resurrection, God’s work, God’s promise, God’s declaration, “You are my child,” and my appeal is through you, my Ambassador, so let your light shine.

My soul clings to you, your right hand holds me fast!

I would ask you to prayerfully consider joining us as a congregation or group or individually for the ongoing work in the New Orleans area through the ministry of Peace, Slidell and its pastor, Barb Simmers. Let us know of your pledge for this coming year of \$600. The need remains high.

PRAYERS FOR THE FARM BILL

Let us keep our senators and representatives in our prayers as they deliberate the Farm Bill that currently cares for 51 million Americans in nutrition programs of food aid, that impacts decisions and policies for commodity subsidies, conservation of our water and land, alternative fuel sources, world trade policy, crop insurance, rural development, to name but a few. Let us also seek to know more about this complex bill which affects every one of us profoundly now and in the future, and then let us respond in ongoing conversation with those who represent us in Washington.

We continue to pray for peace in Iraq. We pray for the people of Iraq who live and die and suffer within their own land; we remember the very young and very old, the weak and vulnerable, and all who love their land. We pray for peace in Iraq and a greater wisdom for those who lead on all sides; we pray with hope, courage, and fear that God's will for peace in this world would be done for all.

158 WRITTEN COMMITMENTS!

I want to thank the 158 congregations who made written commitments of their financial intent for the wider church. Even coming out of the summer months, we are currently \$21,000 above expenses as we fully support our seminary and institutions of the church, fully send our 50% to the ELCA, and seek to fulfill our synod's vision.

I thank our rostered leaders and our lay leaders for YOUR strong partnership and walking with one another as a synod and as part of the whole church. It is YOUR leadership that has made this

possible, your love for the work of the gospel, your speaking to the walking together as the church. Thank you! This is our polity, and you are certainly leaders who embody it so faithfully.

PAPUA NEW GUINEA TRIP – SUMMER 08

Come join us as a representative of your congregation and the Virginia Synod as we travel to our companion synod, the Islands District of the Lutheran Church of Papua New Guinea. We will be stopping in four circuits of our companion synod in order that in each circuit we might have three ongoing conversations: 1) youth sharing faith with youth, 2) congregational leaders sharing faith with congregational leaders, 3) synodical leaders sharing faith with circuit and district leaders.

During our first days in the Kimbe Circuit, we will also be involved with the planning and construction of the district offices. The synod and the youth of the synod have contributed 70% of the funds for this building.

On our way to Papua New Guinea we will spend around 30 hours in Cairns, Australia, by the Great Barrier Reef, and we will return to Cairns for another night's stay on our way back home. This will allow a gradual entry into a different time zone and climate and gradual return.

In seeking to get the best airfares we have a travel agent looking at a variety of flights from both Los Angeles and San Francisco. We will then book your flight with the best option. Recognizing that Roanoke, Dulles, Norfolk, Richmond, and other airports might provide a variety of fares to get to California, we will not include that cost in the \$4500.

We would like to know who will be going with us by September 22, 2007, and we will meet on that day from 1-4pm at Grace Lutheran Church in Waynesboro, Va.

We will meet as a group of 15 several times before we leave next July so that we will be a team of ambassadors for Christ, our congregations, the youth of the synod, and the synod.

Pastors and other youth leaders in Virginia: if you have **young people who have started college, are serving in the military, or are have otherwise changed status this fall**, it will help our young adult ministry if you can collect their contact information and send it to Dave Delaney at the Synod Office, either via surface mail (PO Box 70, Salem 24153) or email (delaney@vasynod.org). As part of our developing KYAC (Keeping Young Adults Connected) ministry, having this data will help us maintain contact with these college students and also extend invitations to serve at our youth events.

The annual **Youth Event Small Group Leader Survey** will be sent out in a couple of weeks. Please take note of the items to be filled out and returned and contact Dave Delaney in case you have adult leaders in your congregation whom you would recommend to serve in small group leadership at our events.

Please note that the date for next year's **Virginia Synod Seventh Day** youth event was incorrect on publicity we distributed during the summer. The correct date for Seventh Day, which is our overnight retreat for 5th and 6th graders, is **March 1-2, 2008**. A complete list of youth events will be available on the website very soon.

Winter Celebration, our annual retreat for students in grades 9-12, will be held at Eagle Eyrie Retreat Center Jan. 25-27 and Feb. 1-3, 2008. Youth may attend one or the other but not both weekends. Congregations are welcome to send two different groups – one each weekend – as long as an adult advisor is present both times. Youth should be reminded that Jan. 26th is an SAT day, so they may either want to schedule their SATs at another time or plan to attend the second weekend. **PLEASE NOTE: PARTICIPANTS ARE *NOT* PERMITTED TO LEAVE WINTER CELEBRATION TO TAKE SATs.** Registration forms for Winter Celebration will be online starting September 17th.

ATTENTION CHURCH COUNCILS AND BUDGET COMMITTEES: As you prepare your 2008 congregational budget, please be sure to include on the line item for Synod Assembly sufficient funds to pay for two or even three youth to attend the 2008 Virginia Synod Youth Assembly, June 6-8, 2008. The cost per person for Youth Assembly will be approximately \$190.

As our Synodical Youth-to-Youth Project for 2006-2007 draws to a close, we have raised more than \$13,000 to add to our previously received monies for the construction of a youth administration and meeting center in the Islands District of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Papua New Guinea. If youth groups were planning to hold fund-raising projects this fall for

Youth to Youth, those monies can still be gathered and added to this fund. Our 2008 Youth-to-Youth project will be for a school development project in Rwanda. This new project will be introduced at Winter Celebration.
